Office of Special Investigations (OSI) Special Agents are a mix of active duty officer and enlisted personnel, civilians, and reservists who share a common desire to serve their country as a member of the Department of the Air Force's premier investigative agency. 

## **ENLISTED AGENT SELECTION OVERVIEW**

The Enlisted Special Agent Selection System is designed to identify and select the most qualified and capable Active Duty Airmen to serve as a Special Agent with the Office of Special Investigations. Armed with elite investigative training and state-of-the-art technology, OSI agents identify, exploit and neutralize criminal, terrorist and intelligence threats to the Department of the Air Force, Department of Defense, and U.S. Government.



### **ENLISTED AGENT SELECTION SYSTEM**



STEP 1 Eligibility

Before officially starting the recruiting process, applicants should determine their eligibility to retrain by visiting their local installation Development Advisor. To apply, you must be a SrA-TSgt and not exceed 11 years' time-in-service at the time of application.

Once you have determined initial eligibility, you must send an email to <u>afosi.enlisted.recruiting@us.af.mil</u> to request access to the Enlisted Agent Applicant Recruitment Portal. Applications are screened for eligibility prior to continuing the process.

<u>Timeframe</u>: The initial applicant questionnaire is reviewed within 72 hours of the submission date. Ensuring retraining eligibility with the Development Advisor and on <u>https://www.osi.af.mil/OSI-</u> <u>Careers/Enlisted/</u> beforehand will be beneficial.



STEP 2 Application

Applicants who pass preliminary screening will be provided a list of up to 13 documents which are listed below that will need to be completed and returned. These documents will then be screened to further assess eligibility and suitability factors.

<u>Timeframe</u>: Applicants will have up to 45 days from the date the email is recieved to complete and return all properly filled out documents. Failure to do so may result in termination from the process. Contact the Enlisted recruiting team early if more time is needed.

STEP 3 Screening

Our team will send the request to the AFPC Assignment Functional who will coordinate with the applicant's Career Field Manager (CFM) to secure a conditional release (if applicable). If the CFM approves a conditional release, AFPC will place a code within your file to prevent you from receiving an assignment during the process. Once completed, we will conduct a law enforcement and financial records check to validate previous information that you provided during Step 2.

<u>Timeframe:</u> The average timeframe for Step 3 is approximately 2-3 weeks. This can take longer depending on the responsiveness of the CFM when requesting a conditional release from your AFSC.



#### STEP 4 Assessment

Applicants will be scheduled to meet with the local OSI office. During the meeting, applicants will have an in-person interview, complete a writing assessment, and complete a computer based cognitive exam. These items will be evaluated by Special Agents to assess your competitiveness for the Agent Suitability Investigation (ASI).

<u>Timeframe</u>: This process takes approximately 14 days to complete. This timeframe is also dependent on the availability of the applicant to complete the required steps.



#### STEP 5 Background Investigation

If selected during Step 4, applicants will undergo a full "Agent Suitability Investigation (ASI)" to determine final suitability for duty as an OSI Special Agent. This step may include interviews with co-workers, supervisors, unit leadership, and others. A final interview will then be scheduled with the OSI detachment commander, or Special Agent in Charge.

If selected for OSI duty following the final interview, you will be scheduled for the next available training date at the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC).

<u>Timeframe</u>: The average background investigation takes approximately 45 days, but can take more depending on the availability of the applicant or interviewees.
