PAID FULL-TIME SUMMER INTERNSHIPS

The Air Force's Office of Special Investigations (OSI) is a federal law enforcement and counterintelligence agency. Armed with elite investigative training and state-of theart technology, OSI's special agents pursue justice as they conduct criminal and counterintelligence investigations, investigate cybercrime, and provide specialized investigative services such as crime scene investigations and digital forensics.

We are seeking current high-potential undergraduate and graduate students to be trained as OSI Criminal Investigators. If selected, students will intern at an OSI Detachment and shadow fully-credentialed federal agents at select Air Force installations. Successful PCIP interns may qualify for a full-time federal law enforcement position within our agency after college graduation.









QUALIFICATIONS & ELIGIBILITY

- · U.S. citizenship required
- Full-time undergraduate student (junior) or graduate student enrolled in an accredited college or university
- GPA 2.95 or above
- Possess a valid driver's license
- Pass all medical and physical requirements
- Ability to obtain Security Clearance (funded by USAF)
- · Pass rigorous background investigation

POTENTIAL TO TRANSITION TO FULL-TIME PALACE ACQUIRE (PAQ) INTERN PROGRAM AFTER COLLEGE GRADUATION

- A formal 3-year training and career development track
- Training at the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC)
- · Real-world investigations and missions
- · Mentoring provided by experienced special agents
- Annual performance-based promotions while in the PAQ program
- Placement into a permanent AFCS position as a Criminal Investigator once the PAQ program is successfully completed
